

GENERAL IGNACIO ZARAGOZA

Ignacio Zaragoza, hero of the Battle of Puebla, was born on March 24, 1829 in Goliad, Texas, which was then known as La Bahia del Espiritu Santo. Son of Miguel G. Zaragoza and Maria de J. Seguin. Ignacio began elementary education at Matamoros, after which he enrolled at Monterrey. He entered the seminary in Monterrey, but then changed his career goals in favor of business. As was probably the trend of the times, he joined Mexico's national army as a sergeant in charge of a company. In 1853 he earned promotion to officer grade as captain.

When the military endorsed the Plan of Ayutla against the centralist government, Zaragoza in uniform joined the liberal movement. He fought at the Battle of Saltillo against the centralist armies of Santa Anna. At the end of 1856, Zaragoza assumed responsibility for the defense of Monterrey. When the army forced Ignacio Comonfort to abandon executive leadership, Zaragoza relocated in Mexico City.

With assistance of infantrymen from the northern regions, Zaragoza began to fight in defense of the Constitution of 1857 and the reform principles inherent in the document. In 1860 he was named commander of military forces at Guadalajara, defeating the troops of Leandro Marquez. At the end of the year, with the grade of a field marshal, he participated in the final battle of the War of the Reform at Calpulapan, serving under the command of Gonzalez Ortega.

In 1861, Zaragoza was named Minister of War in Benito Juarez' government, from which office he resigned in December to accept command of Mexico's Army of the East in battle against the interventionist forces of the Tripartite Alliance. Zaragoza fought the French forces in the mountainous region of Acultzingo. Then he succeeded in halting the advance of French forces at the Battle of Puebla (May 5, 1862), a significant victory for the nationalist which became one of the most important events in Mexican history.

Zaragoza enjoyed little of the victory. A few weeks later he contracted typhoid fever and died in Puebla on September 8, 1862. Memorial services were celebrated all throughout Mexico. Zaragoza was buried in the cemetery of San Fernando in Mexico City, with full military honor as "Benemerito de la Patria."
